From the Chair – James Reinhardt

There is a definite hint of spring in the air. You know where I'm heading with this, so I will take a detour instead. Work has had me traveling recently, and with the travel comes the opportunity (or perhaps I mean "opportunity" to drive rental cars). These are the kind of cars that more than 90% of the motoring public drive day in and day out. These are cars that do exactly what is asked of them, cruise effortlessly at 120km/h, are faultlessly reliable between their enormous service intervals, never leave oil spots behind, sip frugally at their fuel and are mind-numbingly dull. Like refrigerators, these are transport appliances with zero visceral connection to the driver, anesthetic on wheels.

I do not have rose-tinted glasses really. I know that the cars of yesteryear included some pretty awful examples. Before the days of routine galvanizing, cars would rust pretty much before your gaze. I am old enough to remember cars advertised as "ex-highveld" to persuade the buyer that they were less likely to be rust-ridden abominations comprised largely of body filler. There was nothing glamorous or exciting about 5,000km service intervals. But the thoroughly competent rental car I drove last week had controls that were allowed me to connect as close to the action as my DVD remote allows me to connect to Ms Scarlett Johansson.

Rewarding motoring is not about speed. It is about the sensation of commitment, control and communication between driver, car and road. It is about that intangible something that allows the driver to feel "I did that well...I was required to exercise some skill". The very things that engineers have sought to remove from motoring - a noisy exhaust, steering that kicks back through the wheel on rough surfaces, a notchy gear change, a clutch pedal that requires some effort, even a starting routine that requires some technique - are the very things that deliver satisfaction.

Most of you drive some sort of sensible car as well as an MG. In all honesty, a sensible car is what we need most of the time, when all we want is some sort of transport appliance. But the absence of the blandness is exactly what makes old cars such a delight.

You will be able to experience the wonder of the top of the mountain with farm after farm and acres of deciduous fruit trees (pears, apples, plums, nectarines) and valleys of citrus trees (oranges, mineolas, naartjies) growing between the most amazing pre-historic rocks, and views of the Sandveld peeping through luscious green valleys on the mountain top.

Here is your chance to be the guests of Riette and Jeremy Bryant of the farm *Kruistementvlei* on the Langeberg Road on top of the Piketberg mountain. Jeremy will talk to us about the eco-friendly systems on his farm, and how they are helping to save our planet. Riette will give information to those who wish to explore the mountain further, and can explain what is involved in home schooling and developing a reading culture with the local children of the farm labourers. Bring walking shoes if you want to explore!

Join the Veterans group on a day trip up to the farm, and enjoy an open-air farm lunch prepared at a nominal cost of R60 a head. Bring your own wine. The farm meal will include tea or coffee, home baked bread, potjiekos (prepared in a black cast iron pot on the fire) a taste of waterblommetjie bredie (if the water lilies oblige in time!) and a traditional sweet desert. Names and numbers attending are required on the list, for catering purposes. It is essential to know the numbers for lunch, for one cannot just pop round the corner for extra supplies!

Veterans Run 30th July to the Elgin Wine and Apple Country

In spite of the evil prognostications of the weather gnomes in Pretoria, Thursday turned out to be a very pleasant day. Hettie and I had an unusually clear run along Baden-Powell drive to the meeting point at the Engen 1-stop on the N2 where the Capetonians and Swartlanders came together under the leadership of Dieter Reck. We departed on time for Sir Lowry’s Pass with Dieter in the lead in his blue BGT, followed by Meerke in her blue 1949 TC. Fate was looking on benevolently and we had no trouble from the roadworks just after Somerset West. Once over the pass, it was nice to see the green veld and the full Steenbras Dam. We found the Overbergers waiting for us at the turnoff to the Paul Cluwer estate. Incidentally, while chatting, Frank Peché told me that there are now 18 MGs in Napier!

The approach to the estate was down a beautiful tree-lined avenue. We were shown into the wine-tasting area with a view over the orchards where Paul’s daughter acted as hostess and described the wines – Sauvignon Banc, Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and a Noble Late Harvest made from hand-selected Riesling grapes. This was accompanied by freshly-baked bread and honey, the bread being expertly sliced by Paul, a retired neurosurgeon, in person. Afterwards, Paul was seen taking photos of the assembled MGs.

The next stop was quite close by at the Oude Molen brandy distillery where we were treated to a short film of the founder René Santhagen, impersonated by Marius Weyers, driving through the winelands in a beautiful old Hudson (if we can admit that some of those old American monsters can have their good points too). We then went on a tour of the cellar where the brandy is distilled, admiring the huge stainless steel fermentation tanks and the copper stills – the big guns of the industry, named Big Bertha and Long Tom. Then through the barrel storage area to a kind of ghostly chamber with eerie storm effects where we had a presentation about the making of the oak barrels from René Santhagen's ghost. Emerging from the gloom we had the opportunity to taste two of the company's best brandies.

At noon we went to the Bear and Barrel in Elgin where we had a simple but filling meal and drinks.

It was almost 3pm by the time we were finished and most headed straight home. The weather finally did as the weathermen had told it and rain closed in on us on the way back along the N2.
